CRANFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT - 2010

2010 marked the 100th anniversary of the Cranford Public Library. Funded by a grant from the Carnegie Foundation and by the taxpayers of Cranford, the original library building stood on Miln Street. It opened for inspection by the public on Saturday, August 13, 1910 and began full operations on Monday, August 15, 1910. To acknowledge this historic milestone, the library, in conjunction with the Friends of the Cranford Public Library, staged two celebrations in 2010.

The first celebration took place on Sunday, April 18. Guest speakers included State Assemblyman Jon M. Bramnick, Union County Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, Cranford Mayor Mark C. Smith, library board President Patricia Pavlak, Robert Fridlington, Trustee of the Cranford Historical Society, John Malar, Director of the Cranford Public Library, and Jerry Paradiso, President of the Friends of the Cranford Public Library. In recognition of the library centennial, resolutions were presented to the library by Assemblyman Bramnick on behalf of the State Senate and General Assembly, by Freeholder Kowalski, on behalf of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and by Mayor Smith, on behalf of the Cranford Township Committee. Cranford Historical Society Trustee Robert Fridlington presented the library with the Society's Century Award. These documents are now permanently on display on the second floor of the library, along with a handsome rendering of the Miln Street library, which was donated by Library Trustee Judy Panagakos. The celebration also included entertainment by Cranford High School's Madrigal Choir and its jazz ensemble. Attendance totaled 289.

Subsequent to the April 18th celebration, the library received a United States flag that had been flown over the United States Capitol. The flag was sent by Representative Leonard Lance in honor of the library's 100th anniversary.

The second library centennial celebration, a birthday party for children and their families, took place on Saturday, August 14. Funded by the Friends of the Cranford Public Library, the day included a face painter, a balloon sculptor, cup cakes, and a birthday cake, compliments of the Vanilla Beanery of Cranford. Approximately 300 children and adults attended the event.

As part of the library centennial celebration, a children's "Books We Love" quilt was installed on Saturday, December 11. Nineteen children, representing all of Cranford's elementary and middle public schools and St. Michael's School, participated in the creation of the quilt. Each child, with the help of a parent or friend, created a quilt square that depicts his or her favorite book. The quilt is now on permanent display at the entrance to the children's room. A major debt of gratitude is owed to Ellen Hess, who coordinated the creation of the quilt, supplied participants with her expertise, and stitched together the quilt. Thirty-one people attended the quilt unveiling.

Circulation

Total circulation in 2010 was 263,841, a total exceeded only in 2009 and 1971¹. Per capita circulation in 2010 was 11.66, the second highest in library history. Some of the fall off from

2009 is due to the fact that the library was open four fewer days in 2010 than in 2009.² Circulation of adult materials totaled 107,574, which is the third time it has exceeded the 100,000 mark since 1998. Adult book circulation was down just slightly from 2009—from 69,997 to 69,036. The number of audio-books and e-books downloaded increased considerably, from 559 to 1,172. Downloadable books are available to Cranford patrons from a service called ListenNJ. In addition to the title listings on the ListenNJ site, the library began listing titles in its online catalog late in the year; as a result, circulation of these items is likely to increase once again in 2010.

Total circulation of young adult materials grew again in 2010, going from 7,331 to 7,841. Particular growth was seen in young adult fiction, which went from 4,556 to 4,664, and graphic novels, which went from 1,528 to 1,766. Total children's circulation decreased from 160,255 in 2009, an all-time record, to 148,786, still the second highest total in library history. 2010 marks the seventh time that children's circulation has topped 100,000.³

The library is a member of MURAL (Middlesex Union Reciprocal Agreement Libraries), a system that allows a patron to borrow materials directly from 40 public libraries in Union and Middlesex counties by simply showing his or her hometown library card. In 2009 the Cranford Public Library lent 18,661 items to patrons from MURAL libraries. The 2010 figure was 22,172, a 19% increase. This is an indication that the Cranford Library's collection is highly valued, not only within Cranford, but beyond its borders as well.

Membership

Library membership in 2010 totaled 9,816, broken down as follows: 7,298 adults, 12 purchased cards, 674 young adults, and 1,832 children. In addition, 841 MURAL borrowers were registered at year's end. Public use of the Internet continued strong in 2010, with a total of 18,232 sessions taking place, an increase of 211 over 2009.

Programs and Attendance

Library programming remained prominent in 2010. Adult programs, many sponsored by the Friends of the Cranford Public Library, included 22 foreign film presentations, 49 classic film presentation, 18 documentary film presentations and 9 meetings of the Readers' Forum, the library's book discussion group. In addition, 36 other special adult programs took place. For a list of these programs, please see page 13. Between the regularly scheduled programs listed above and the special programs, attendance at adult programs totaled 4,564 in 2011.

The young adult department staged 35 special programs that netted a total attendance of 626. In addition, the 14 young adult film presentations attracted a total of 263 viewers, 105 teen/senior citizen tutoring sessions took place, with a total of 275 tutors and students participating, 63 young adults attended seven teen advisory board meetings, and 85 young adults took part in the young adult summer reading program, reading a total of 1,594 books.

The children's room presented 8 special programs, which drew a total attendance of 805. There were seven class and scout visits, with the number of visitors totaling 152, and 88 story hours,

which attracted 851 children. In addition, 759 children participated in the summer reading program, reading a total of 17,644 hours. Approximately 500 children and parents attended the program-ending carnival. The children's department also staged its seventh annual Scholastic Book Fair in June 2010.

According to the library's people counting machines, which are stationed at the three public entrances, the number of people who visited the library in 2010 totaled 179,404, or an average of 608 per day. This figure does not include the thousands of people who patronized the book sales in the library basement staged by the Friends of the Library in January, March, June, August and October.

Grants & Gifts

As it does year in and year out, the library benefited tremendously from the generosity of the Friends of the Cranford Public Library. Paid membership in the Friends numbered 358 at the end of 2010. Using membership dues and funds raised primarily from their book sales, the Friends were able to contribute \$18,012 to the library in 2010. New in 2010

The library instituted its first ever adult summer reading program in June 2010. Like the children's and young adult summer reading programs, the adult summer reading program distributed prizes and provided a number of free programs to participants. More than 200 adults participated, and the library plans to offer the program again in 2011.
